Disclaimer: Data used to inform the development of this report was collected on 4/3/17 from the data provider Economic Modeling Specialists, Inc. (Emsi), a labor market database that compiles job postings from national, public, and corporate sources. Data may not be a comprehensive set of all online job postings because of continued data processing by Emsi. The EDB is confident of the accuracy of the data at the time it was collected.

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

### **OVERALL JOB POSTINGS**

More than 11,300 job postings were advertised in February 2017, an increase of 19.1% compared to the same period in 2016.

#### POSTINGS BY OCCUPATION GROUP

With 1,787 and 1,622 postings, the *Transportation and Material Moving Occupations* and *Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations* had the most job postings in February 2017.

### **POSTINGS BY LOCATION**

In the two-month period from January 1, 2017 to February 28, 2017, Santa Rosa had 8,831 public online job postings and continues to have nearly double the number of job postings of any other Sonoma County city.

### LOCAL EMPLOYERS

Data for the top 20 employers was aggregated from online public job postings provided by Economic Modeling Specialists, Inc. (Emsi). Emsi is unable to access any non-publicly posted jobs, so data may not reflect the exact hiring demands of Sonoma County employers.

### OCCUPATION GROUPS

The Bureau of Labor Statistics Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) System organizes more than 700 occupations, placing each occupation into one of 23 distinct groups. Data for the top five occupational groups in Sonoma County based on the volume of online job postings for January 2017 and February 2017 was provided by Economic Modeling Specialists, Inc. (Emsi). Emsi is unable to access any non-publicly posted jobs, so data may not reflect the exact hiring demands of Sonoma County employers.







### **CITY JOB POSTING PERCENTAGE**




### TOP 15 OCCUPATIONS BY JOB POSTING VOLUME
