# HIGHLIGHTS

## OVERALL JOB POSTINGS

More than 10,600 job postings were advertised in March 2017, an increase of 6.1% compared to the same period in 2016.

## POSTINGS BY OCCUPATION GROUP

With 1,545 and 1,475 postings, the *Sales and Related Occupations* and *Transportation and Material Moving Occupations* had the most job postings in March 2017.

## POSTINGS BY LOCATION

In the two-month period from February 1, 2017 to March 31, 2017, Santa Rosa had 8,845 public online job postings and continues to have nearly double the number of job postings of any other Sonoma County city.

# OCCUPATION GROUPS

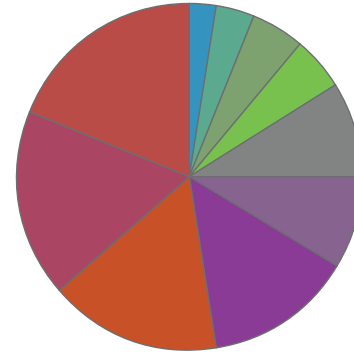

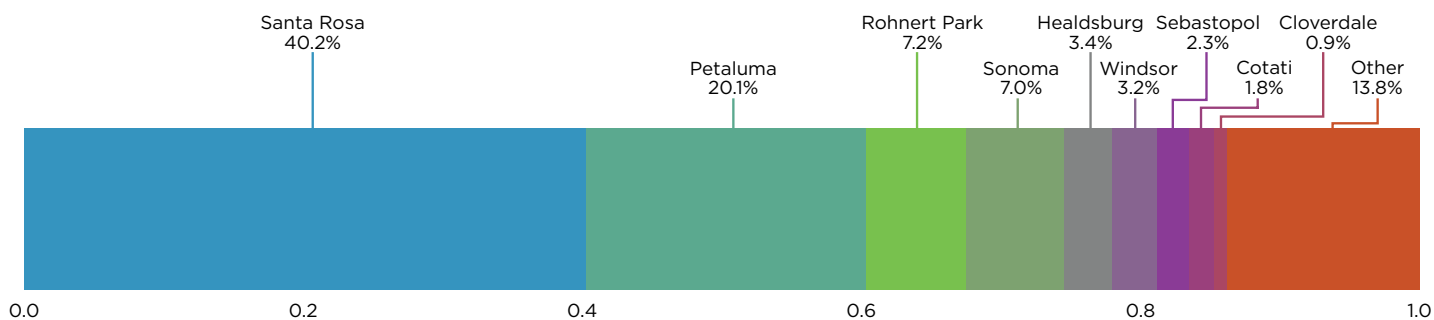

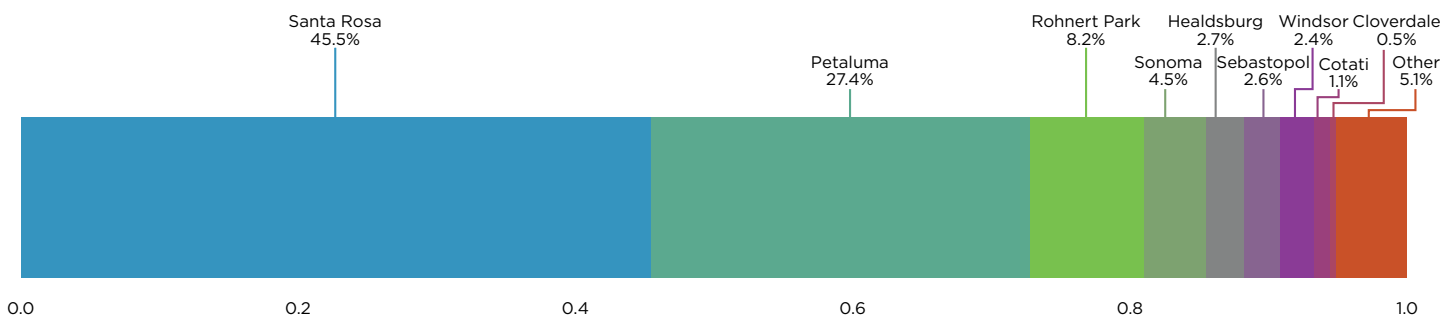
