Interplay with Existing Features	Describe how adaptable the site is for various memorial elements like walkways, seating, and landscaping (recognizing that we don't yet know the type of art or the exact location)
Overall Suitability	Offer a concluding statement on the overall suitability of the site. Describe how well it fulfills the memorial's objectives and resonates with the Fire Memorial Task Force. Provide our vision for the site's evolution into a meaningful and impactful memorial space.
