# III. POLICY/PROGRAM UPDATES: BOARD FEEDBACK/QUESTIONS ON INFORMATION ITEMS

### A. Creative Sonoma

The job announcement for the Director position went live this week and will be posted at a wide variety of sources. These include local, regional, and national arts sites, economic development associations, grant makers organizations, regular job sites (Indeed, etc.), local publications (Press Democrat, La Voz, etc.), regional universities and colleges, the Creative Sonoma newsletter, and more.

The Public Art Ad Hoc committee met in July to discuss final details of the proposed Public art Policy and Master Plan. We received feedback on the remaining key questions and guidance from the CAO that are strong enough for us to finalize drafts and bring them forward to the full Board of Supervisors in September. The Master Plan will be posted to the Creative Sonoma website with an encouragement for public feedback. We will have one more meeting of the Ad Hoc to review final drafts and board presentation materials.







Board members expressed their appreciation for Kirsten and all her accomplishments throughout the year for the department.

#### B. Broadband

On August 1st staff provided recommendations to the Board of Supervisors for further direction on low-level projects, governance structure and ideas around additional funding opportunities to expand low-level design. Below is a re-cap of the approved recommended actions...

- Approved recommendations
  - Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Golden State Connect Authority
  - Uncodified Ordinance
  - Selected Priority Areas
    - The Sonoma County Board of Supervisors analyzed a list of 23 proposed priority areas and identified 7 areas (213 miles total) to prioritize for low level (shovel ready) engineering designs for. The areas selected by the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors are: 1. Jenner 4.87 miles 2. East Santa Rosa 24.96 miles 3. Walsh Landing 12.18 miles 4. East Cloverdale / Preston 44.42 miles 5. West Cloverdale 41.75 miles 6. Mark West / Shiloh 49.24 miles 7. Annapolis 36.18 miles
  - o American Rescue Plan Act funding allocation
  - Delegate Authority for Grant Agreements
  - Delegate Authority for Low-Level Design Expansion
    - The Sonoma County Board of Supervisors delegated authority to the Economic Development Board's executive director to expand an existing agreement with Golden State connect authority for low level design. This expansion will fold in the additional ~160 miles of shovel ready engineering design.

The Economic Development Board is prepared to engage in an agreement with Golden State Connect Authority to design, deploy, operate, and maintain broadband infrastructure in Sonoma County. One of the first of many steps towards financing this infrastructure will be an infrastructure grant application submission by Golden State Connect Authority to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for the Federal Funding Account award opportunity. The Board also provided interest and guidance to staff to further investigate public private partnerships for areas that are not feasible to Golden State Connect







Authority's open access model. Staff is reaching out to incumbent internet service providers to preliminarily inquire about their interest and insights around public private partnerships. In addition to the actions above, staff is keeping local partners up to date about the progress, opportunities, and obstacles surrounding broadband deployment in Sonoma County. Local partners include Cities, private providers, non-profits, tribes, and residents.
